Located in Erie, Pennsylvania, UPMC Hamot serves patients from the surrounding area in a tradition of quality, health, healing, and education. One of the region's leading tertiary care facilities, UPMC Hamot was founded in 1881, and became part of UPMC in 2011.

This past year, UPMC Hamot contributed more than \$33 million in community benefits, including \$5.6 million to the city of Erie, Erie County, its schools, local police and fire departments, nonprofit organizations, and community groups.

- UPMC Hamot provides highly specialized tertiary care, and regional physician training programs that include orthopaedic surgery and hand surgery.
- The hospital is the only Level II trauma center in the northwestern Pennsylvania region, and provides lifesaving care to many of the region's most seriously injured patients.
- UPMC Hamot Women's Hospital addresses the health care needs of women and infants. The facility's Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit cares for the most fragile of newborns.
- The UPMC Hamot Heart and Vascular Institute coordinates and manages delivery of cardiovascular care to patients throughout the region.

Serving as an Important Resource to the Community


- The hospital dedicated more than \$23 million to uncompensated care, including \$9.7 million in charity care and \$13.8 million in shortfalls in payments from government programs for the poor.
- Through Wayne Primary Care, the first school-based health center in Erie County, UPMC Hamot provides health care to communities in need.

CREATING A HEALTHIER COMMUNITY

Promoting Healthy Lives During and After Pregnancy

- UPMC Hamot's Stork Support Program offers pregnant women education about healthy behaviors during pregnancy and regular visits with a registered nurse, which are especially helpful for at-risk pregnant women.
- The hospital also offers free car seat safety checks to new parents.

Providing Programs That Help Prevent Disease and Injury

- Heart disease and cancer screenings are offered at convenient locations, including physician offices and at community health events.
- The hospital offers several injury prevention programs targeting youth, including ATV safety classes, distribution of free bike helmets, and a driving simulator that demonstrates the dangers of driving under the influence.

Enhancing Care for Individuals During End of Life

- UPMC Hamot's palliative care team works with patients and families to help ensure that end-of-life wishes are met.
- Led by a board-certified palliative care physician, this service minimizes physical, spiritual, psychosocial, and psychological pain for patients with chronic illnesses and their families.

This past year, UPMC Hamot's free community health screenings were provided to more than 7,000 individuals.




The hospital promotes primary care and preventive screenings to uninsured and Medicaid-eligible individuals.

In 2013, UPMC Hamot conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment which brought together community leaders and public health experts to identify and discuss local health needs, and included data gathered through a local collaborative led by the Erie County Department of Health. The assessment showed that **preventive screenings, maternal and infant health, and end-of-life care** are important health topics for UPMC Hamot to focus on over the next three years.
